

BYLAW 2006-002

**BYLAW REGARDING THE REMUNERATION
OF ELECTED MUNICIPAL OFFICERS**

WHEREAS the Municipality, may, by bylaw set the remuneration and expense allowance for the council members; and

WHEREAS the *Act Respecting the Remuneration of Elected Municipal Officers* (L.R.Q., c.T-11.001) determines the parameters that must be respected in regard to this matter; and

WHEREAS this present bylaw 2006-002 is the object of a notice of motion given at the sitting held January 11, 2006;

WHEREAS a copy of the present bylaw was given to all members of council at least two days prior to the siting; and

WHEREAS the members of council declare having read the said bylaw and renounces its reading; and

WHEREAS during the sitting, the director-general, briefs the council on the content of the said bylaw; and

WHEREAS copies of the bylaw have been made available to the public at the beginning of the sitting;

THEREFORE,

THAT the following bylaw regarding the remuneration of elected municipal officers and bearing the number 2006-002 be hereby adopted.

Article 1: Title

The present bylaw shall bear the title "Bylaw Regarding the Remuneration Of Elected Municipal Officers".

Article 2: Purpose

The present bylaw shall set the remuneration and expense allowance for the Mayor and members of the council of the Municipality.

Article 3: Terminology

Basic remuneration

Signifies the remuneration paid to the mayor and councillors of the municipality for services rendered.

Additional Remuneration

Signifies an additional remuneration offered to the deputy mayor when he/she is required to replace the mayor for a period exceeding 30 consecutive days.

Compensation Allowance

Signifies an allocation offered to the deputy mayor as a means of compensation while carrying out the duties of the Mayor.

Expense Allowance

This amount corresponds to an amount equal to one half of the amount of the basic remuneration.

Article 4: Basic Remuneration

The basic annual remuneration for the mayor shall be \$2, 840.00 and \$946.00 for councillors.

Article 5: Annual Consumer Price Index of the Basic Remuneration

The basic remuneration shall be the object of an annual increase, as the case may be, in accordance to the consumer price index established by Statistics Canada.

Article 6: Expense Allowance

In addition to the remuneration mentioned above, the Mayor and Councillors shall receive an expense allowance for an amount equal to one half of the basic remuneration.

Article 7: Payment

The remuneration mentioned in Articles 4 & 6 shall be paid to each of the members of council at the end of each month.

Article 8: Additional Remuneration for the Deputy Mayor

The deputy mayor shall be paid an additional remuneration when he/she is required to carry out the duties of the Mayor. This remuneration is paid only when the deputy mayor is required to replace the Mayor for more than 30 consecutive days beginning on the thirty-first day and continues until which time the Mayor is able to carry out his/her duties.

During the replacement period, the deputy mayor shall receive remuneration equal to that of the mayor.

Article 9: This present bylaw repeals all former bylaws in regard to remuneration of elected municipal officers.

Article 10: This present bylaw is retroactive to January 1, 2006.

Article 11: **Coming into Effect**

This bylaw comes into effect in accordance to the law.
